In 1974 with other 8 families of the district they founded the Cooperative Speranza initially for the slaughtering and for direct sale of the meat, in 2008 the Cooperative Speranza has also entered the field of production of Energy with the construction of 2 Biogas from biomass plants for a total electric power of 2 Mw, whose thermal energy is transferred to a nearby hospital. At the moment a third plant is being built for the production of LNG (liquid methane for transport).

In recent years we have used ISMEA facilities on two occasions, a purchase of a fund with a retention of title agreement for the family company and a loan with ISMEA guarantee for the construction of the second Biogas plant of the Cooperativa Speranza.
